INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY



FOUR PARTS OF INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY

1. Graduation from high school

2. MINIMUM CORE GPA

3. MINIMUM CORRESPONDING ACT OR SAT SCORE

4. COMPLETION OF 16 CORE COURSES

CHANGES TO INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY STRUCTURE-EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2016

- THREE CATEGORIES OF ELIGIBILITY
 - Qualifier: Eligible for athletics aid, practice, and competition during first year of enrollment
 - MINIMUM 2.300 CORE GPA
 - ACADEMIC REDSHIRT: ELIGIBLE FOR ATHLETICS AID IN FIRST YEAR OF ENROLLMENT AND FOR PRACTICE DURING FIRST TERM OF ENROLLMENT
 - MINIMUM 2.000 CORE GPA
 - Must pass at least 9 hours during first collegiate semester to be eligible for practice second term of enrollment
 - MAY NOT ENGAGE IN COMPETITION DURING FIRST YEAR OF ENROLLMENT
 - NON-QUALIFIER: INELIGIBLE FOR ATHLETICS AID, PRACTICE, AND COMPETITION DURING FIRST YEAR OF ENROLLMENT
 - BELOW 2.000 CORE GPA, INSUFFICIENT TEST SCORE, LESS THAN 16 CORE COURSES

DEFINITION OF A CORE COURSE

- 1. Recognized academic course that qualifies for graduation
 - I.E.: English, Math, Natural/Physical Science, Social Science, Foreign Language, Non-doctrinal Religion/Philosophy
- 2. Considered college prepatory
 - ACADEMICALLY PREPARES A STUDENT TO ENTER A 4 YEAR COLLEGE
- 3. MATH IS COMPLETED AT THE LEVEL OF ALGEBRA 1 OR HIGHER
- 4. TAUGHT BY A QUALIFIED INSTRUCTOR
- 5. TAUGHT AT OR ABOVE THE REGULAR ACADEMIC LEVEL

NONTRADITIONAL COURSES

CREDIT RECOVERY, DISTANCE LEARNING, INDEPENDENT STUDY, INDIVIDUALIZED INSTRUCTION, CORRESPONDENCE, ET CETERA

- $1.\quad$ Meets all requirements of a core course
- 2. Instructor and student have ongoing access to one another for purposes of teaching, evaluating, providing assistance
- 3. Instructor and student have regular interaction for purposes of teaching, evaluation, providing assistance
- 4. Completed work is available for evaluation and validation
- 5. EVALUATION OF WORK IS COMPLETED BY APPROPRIATE ACADEMIC AUTHORITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED ACADEMIC POLICIES
- 6. Course includes defined time period for completion
- 7. Course is acceptable for any student and placed on the high school transcript

- 4 English
- 3 Mathematics

- 1 Additional English, Mathematics, or Natural or Physical Science
- 2 SOCIAL SCIENCE
- 4 ADDITIONAL CORE COURSES (FROM ANY OF THE ABOVE SUBJECT AREAS OR FOREIGN LANGUAGE, PHILOSOPHY, OR NON-DOCTRINAL RELIGION)

ADDITIONAL CORE COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR QUALIFIERS— EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2016

- 10 of the 16 required core courses must be Completed prior to the start of the 7th semester of HIGH SCHOOL
 - THIS INCLUDES SUMMER SCHOOL BETWEEN THE END OF JUNIOR YEAR AND THE START OF SENIOR YEAR
- 7 OF THESE 10 COURSES MUST BE ENGLISH, MATH, AND NATURAL/PHYSICAL SCIENCE
- THE GRADES FOR THESE 10 COURSES MUST BE USED IN
 CALCULATING GPA AND CANNOT BE REPLACED BY
 CLASSES COMPLETED AT A LATER DATE

HOW TO PREPARE FOR QUALIFIER STATUS

- FRESHMAN YEAR
 - CAREFULLY (AND STRATEGICALLY!) CHOOSE COURSES
 - APPROVED COURSE LISTS CAN BE FOUND AT ELIGIBILITYCENTER.ORG UNDER THE RESOURCES TAB
 - SEARCH BY HIGH SCHOOL NAME OR CEEB CODE

- SOPHOMORE YEAR
 - CAREFULLY (AND STRATEGICALLY!) CHOOSE COURSES

HOW TO PREPARE FOR QUALIFIER STATUS

JUNIOR YEAR

- CAREFULLY (AND STRATEGICALLY!) CHOOSE COURSES
- Take ACT/SAT and report score to the Eligibility Center (Code: 9999)
- ALL ACT/SAT SCORES MUST BE SENT DIRECTLY TO THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER FROM THE TESTING AGENCY (NCAA BYLAW 14.3.1.3.4)
- REGISTER WITH THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER AT ELIGIBILITY CENTER. ORG
- SUBMIT AN OFFICIAL 6TH SEMESTER TRANSCRIPT TO THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER

SENIOR YEAR

- Course selection is critical!!
- RETAKE ACT/SAT, IF NECESSARY, AND SUBMIT SCORE TO THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER

AFTER SENIOR YEAR

 SUBMIT FINAL OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT WITH PROOF OF GRADUATION TO THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER

TRANSCRIPT ACCURACY IS KEY

 ONCE THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER HAS RECEIVED AN OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT, A REVISED TRANSCRIPT WILL NOT BE IMMEDIATELY ACCEPTED

 THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER MAY REQUIRE ADDITIONAL SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION BEFORE ACCEPTING TRANSCRIPT CHANGES

 AN INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY WAIVER MAY BE REQUIRED IN INSTANCES OF AN ALTERED FINAL TRANSCRIPT

CORE-CURRICULUM TIME LIMITATION

- A PROSPECT MUST COMPLETE CORE-CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS NOT LATER THAN THE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION DATE OF HIS OR HER HIGH SCHOOL CLASS
 - Anticipated graduation date is determined by the prospect's 9th grade enrollment
- EXCEPTION: A PROSPECT WHO GRADUATES ON TIME WITH HIS OR HER HIGH SCHOOL CLASS MAY USE 1 CORE COURSE COMPLETED IN THE YEAR FOLLOWING GRADUATION
- EXCEPTION: A PROSPECT WITH A DIAGNOSED EDUCATION IMPACTING DISABILITY WHO GRADUATES ON TIME WITH HIS OR HER CLASS MAY USE UP TO 3 CORE COURSES COMPLETED DURING THE YEAR AFTER GRADUATION

DIVISION II INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- QUALIFIER: ELIGIBLE FOR PRACTICE, COMPETITION, AID
 - GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL
 - COMPLETE 16 CORE COURSES AS FOLLOWS:
 - 3 ENGLISH
 - 2 MATH (ALGEBRA 1 OR HIGHER)
 - 2 NATURAL/PHYSICAL SCIENCE
 - 3 additional English, math, natural/physical science
 - 2 SOCIAL SCIENCE
 - 4 ADDITIONAL CORE
 - EARN A 2.00 CORE GPA OR HIGHER
 - ACHIEVE A 68 ACT SUM SCORE OR AN 820 COMBINED SAT SCORE
- PARTIAL QUALIFIER: PRACTICE AND AID ONLY DURING FIRST YEAR
 - GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL
 - Do one of the following:
 - ACHIEVE A 68 ACT SUM SCORE OR AN 820 COMBINED SAT SCORE
 - COMPLETE 16 CORE COURSES (SEE ABOVE) WITH AT LEAST A 2.00 GPA
- NON-QUALIFIER: NO PRACTICE, COMPETITION, AID DURING FIRST YEAR
- EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2018:
 - MINIMUM TEST SCORE REQUIREMENT WILL BE REPLACED WITH AN INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY INDEX SIMILAR TO DIVISION I SLIDING SCALE
 - MINIMUM GPA TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR COMPETITION WILL INCREASE TO A 2.20
 - MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR PRACTICE AND AID ONLY WITH A 2.00

NAIA FRESHMAN ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- GRADUATE FROM AN ACCREDITED HIGH SCHOOL
 OR BE ACCEPTED AS A REGULAR STUDENT IN
 GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING
- COMPLETE TWO OF THE FOLLOWING THREE:
 - ACHIEVE A MINIMUM ACT COMPOSITE SCORE OF 18 OR SAT COMBINED SCORE OF 860
 - EARN A MINIMUM 2.00 GPA ON A 4.0 SCALE
 - GRADUATE IN THE TOP 50%

DEFINITIONS

• AMATEURISM: STUDENT-ATHLETES SHALL BE AMATEURS IN AN INTERCOLLEGIATE SPORT, AND THEIR PARTICIPATION SHOULD BE MOTIVATED PRIMARILY BY EDUCATION AND BY THE PHYSICAL, MENTAL AND SOCIAL BENEFITS TO BE DERIVED. STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS IS AN AVOCATION, AND STUDENT-ATHLETES SHOULD BE PROTECTED FROM EXPLOITATION BY PROFESSIONAL AND COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES

 Professional Athlete: An athlete who receives any kind of payment, directly or indirectly, for athletics participation

AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION

- ALL STUDENT-ATHLETES ENTERING A DIVISION I OR DIVISION II INSTITUTION MUST COMPLETE THE AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION PROCESS
- BOTH DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL PROSPECTS MUST COMPLETE AN AMATEURISM QUESTIONNAIRE DURING REGISTRATION FOR THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER
 - INCLUDED IN REGISTRATION FEE
 - STUDENTS WHO QUALIFY FOR AN ACT OR SAT FEE WAIVER MAY QUALIFY FOR ELIGIBILITY CENTER FEE WAIVER
- AMATEURISM STATUS IS DETERMINED BY THE RESPONSES PROVIDED BY THE PROSPECT

WHAT TYPE OF QUESTIONS WILL BE ASKEDS

- Contracts with professional
 Preferential treatment based TEAM
 - ON ATHLETICS PARTICIPATION OR REPUTATION
- SALARY FOR PARTICIPATING IN **ATHLETICS**
- TRYOUTS, PRACTICE, OR COMPETITION WITH A PROFESSIONAL TEAM
- PRIZE MONEY ABOVE ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES
- BENEFITS FROM AN AGENT OR PROSPECTIVE AGENT
- Play with professionals

- AGREEMENT TO BE REPRESENTED BY AN AGENT
- EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES FROM INDIVIDUAL OR ENTITY OTHER THAN A PARENT
- ORGANIZED COMPETITION RULE

GENERAL INFORMATION

• SPORT-SPECIFIC

- ELITE ATHLETES WILL BE REVIEWED AUTOMATICALLY BY THE NCAA STAFF
- BASEBALL, BASKETBALL, AND FOOTBALL ATHLETES MAY BE EVALUATED WITH A LEVEL OF HIGHER SCRUTINY DUE TO GENERAL SPORT-SPECIFIC CONCERNS
- Must complete before a written offer of aid may be issued by a Division I institution

RELAXED AMATEURISM LEGISLATION

- STUDENT-ATHLETES ENTERING A DIVISION I SCHOOL FOR THE FIRST TIME ON OR AFTER AUGUST 1, 2013 MAY RECEIVE PRIZE MONEY AND FUNDING FROM SOURCES OTHER THAN A PARENT OR CLUB TEAM
 - THE AMOUNT MAY NOT EXCEED ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES FOR PRACTICE AND COMPETITION
 - EXPENSES MAY BE CALCULATED OVER A CALENDAR YEAR RATHER
 THAN ON A PER EVENT BASIS
 - Never accept any benefits from an agent or runner or from a booster!

RECRUITING DEFINITIONS

- CONTACT: ANY FACE-TO-FACE ENCOUNTER BETWEEN A PROSPECT OR PROSPECT'S RELATIVE OR LEGAL GUARDIAN AND AN INSTITUTIONAL STAFF MEMBER OR ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE DURING WHICH ANY DIALOGUE OCCURS IN EXCESS OF AN EXCHANGE OF GREETINGS.
- EVALUATION: ANY OFF-CAMPUS ACTIVITY DESIGNED TO ASSESS THE ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS OR ATHLETICS ABILITY OF A PROSPECT.
- TELEPHONE CALLS: ALL ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMITTED HUMAN VOICE EXCHANGE.
- ELECTRONIC CORRESPONDENCE: EMAIL, FAX, INSTANT MESSENGER, TEXT MESSAGE, SOCIAL MEDIA (I.E. FACEBOOK, TWITTER, INSTAGRAM, SNAPCHAT, ET CETERA)

RECRUITING DEFINITIONS CONTINUED

OFFICIAL VISIT: A VISIT TO CAMPUS FINANCED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY THE MEMBER INSTITUTION, INCLUDING TRANSPORTATION, LODGING, MEALS

- ullet May pay lodging and meals only for up to two parents/legal guardians
 - BASKETBALL: MAY PROVIDE TRAVEL EXPENSES FOR UP TO TWO PARENTS/LEGAL GUARDIANS
 - FOOTBALL: MAY PROVIDE MEALS FOR UP TO FOUR FAMILY MEMBERS.
- MAY PROVIDE UP TO 3 COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSIONS TO HOME ATHLETICS CONTESTS.
 - May provide 2 additional admissions in the instance of a nontraditional family
 - FOOTBALL: MAY PROVIDE COMPLIMENTARY 5 COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSIONS (FOR FAMILY MEMBERS ONLY)
- Maximum of 5 visits per prospect and 1 visit per school
- May not occur prior to the start of senior year in high school
 - Men's Basketball: May occur on or after January 1st of Junior Year
 - Women's Basketball: May occur on or after the Thursday following the Division I championship during Junior Year
- MAXIMUM 48 HOURS IN LENGTH
- ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS FOR VISIT:
 - Test score (SAT, ACT, PLAN, PSAT)
 - HS OR COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT
 - Must register with the Eligibility Center and be placed on the institution's IRL

RECRUITING DEFINITIONS CONTINUED

Unofficial Visit: A visit to a Campus made at the prospective student-athlete's own expense

- MAY PROVIDE UP TO 3 COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSIONS TO HOME ATHLETICS CONTESTS
 - May provide 2 additional complimentary admissions in the instance of a nontraditional family
- MAY TAKE AN UNOFFICIAL VISIT AT ANY TIME EXCEPT:
 - DURING A DEAD PERIOD
 - IN BASKETBALL, DURING THE MONTH OF JULY
- MAY TAKE AN UNLIMITED NUMBER OF UNOFFICIAL VISITS

COUNTING CONTACTS AND EVALUATIONS

- EVALUATIONS MAY OCCUR AT ANY TIME DURING HIGH SCHOOL AND MAY ALSO OCCUR PRIOR TO 9TH GRADE
- BASKETBALL: A TOTAL OF 7 CONTACTS AND/OR EVALUATIONS
 - CONTACTS DURING JUNIOR YEAR MAY ONLY BE AT SCHOOL OR AT HOME
 - NO CONTACT IS PERMITTED WHILE CLASSES ARE IN SESSION.
 - ON-CAMPUS EVALUATION (I.E. A TRYOUT) IS PERMITTED AFTER SENIOR SEASON
 - Must be 2 hours in length or less
 - Women's Basketball: except for permissible evaluations, all other forms of recruiting and communication are prohibited during July

FOOTBALL:

- 3 TOTAL EVALUATIONS
 - 1 EVALUATION IN THE FALL
 - 2 EVALUATIONS BETWEEN APRIL 15 AND MAY 31 (HEAD COACH MAY NOT RECRUIT DURING THIS TIME)
- Limited to 6 total contacts
- ALL OTHER SPORTS: A TOTAL OF 7 CONTACTS AND/OR EVALUATIONS BUT NO MORE THAN 3 CONTACTS
 - TRACK AND FIELD AND CROSS COUNTRY ARE CONSIDERED THE SAME SPORT FOR PURPOSES OF COUNTING RECRUITING OPPORTUNITIES

POST-COMMITMENT

- AFTER A PROSPECT SIGNS A NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT OR FINANCIAL AID AGREEMENT —OR— PROVIDES A FINANCIAL DEPOSIT TO THE INSTITUTION IN RESPONSE TO AN OFFER OF ADMISSION:
 - NO LIMIT ON CONTACTS OR EVALUATIONS
 - COACHES STILL MAY NOT VISIT THE HIGH SCHOOL MORE THAN ONCE PER WEEK IN THE SPORTS OF FOOTBALL AND MEN'S BASKETBALL
 - CONTACTS MAY OCCUR DURING A DEAD PERIOD (NOT AT SCHOOL THOUGH)
 - Unlimited telephone calls for all sports
 - Unlimited text messages and other forms of electronic communication for all sports

NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT

- BINDING ONE-YEAR AGREEMENT
- Prospect must attend that institution for one year.
 - If the NLI agreement is broken, the basic penalty is to sit out of competition for a year and lose a year of eligibility in ALL sports
- Institution must offer athletics aid in conjunction with the NLI (financial aid agreement)
 - CONFERENCES MAY REQUIRE ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS (I.E. A CONFERENCE AID AGREEMENT) WHICH MAY ALSO CARRY ADDITIONAL PENALTIES IF THE PROSPECT FAILS TO SATISFY THE TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT
- ATHLETICS AID AGREEMENT CAN BE FOR ONE YEAR AND RENEWED ON AN ANNUAL BASIS —OR— CAN BE OFFERED ON A MULTI-YEAR BASIS (UP TO FIVE YEARS)

- EQUIVALENCY: ATHLETICS AID AWARDED ON A PERCENT BASIS, FROM 1 TO 100 PERCENT

- AWARD MAY COVER (IN FULL OR IN PART) TUITION, FEES, ROOM, BOARD, BOOKS, AND OTHER

 - Capped at the institutional cost of attendance
- There is no limit on the number of years of aid, so long as coursework toward a bachelor's degree is in progress
 - A STUDENT-ATHLETE WITH REMAINING ATHLETICS ELIGIBILITY MAY RECEIVE AID WHILE PURSUING
 A GRADUATE DEGREE
- ATHLETICS AID MAY NOT BE CANCELLED AT ANY TIME FOR AN ATHLETICS REASON
- SUMMER ATHLETICS AID MAY BE PROVIDED TO INCOMING STUDENT-ATHLETES, EVEN IF NOT RECEIVING AID DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

 - AWARDING PROGRAM MUST BE "ESTABLISHED AND CONTINUING"
 - AWARD MAY NOT RESTRICT CHOICE OF INSTITUTION
 - NO DIRECT CONNECTION BETWEEN AWARDING ENTITY AND INSTITUTION
 - AWARDING ORGANIZATION MAY NOT CONDUCT SPORTS PROGRAM.
- Institutional aid (i.e. academic based) may necessitate a reduction in athletics aid
 - MUST MEET MINIMUM ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS TO EXEMPT FROM SPORT AID TOTALS (TOP 10% OF CLASS OR 3.5 CUMULATIVE GPA OR 105 ACT SUM/1200 SAT SCORE)
