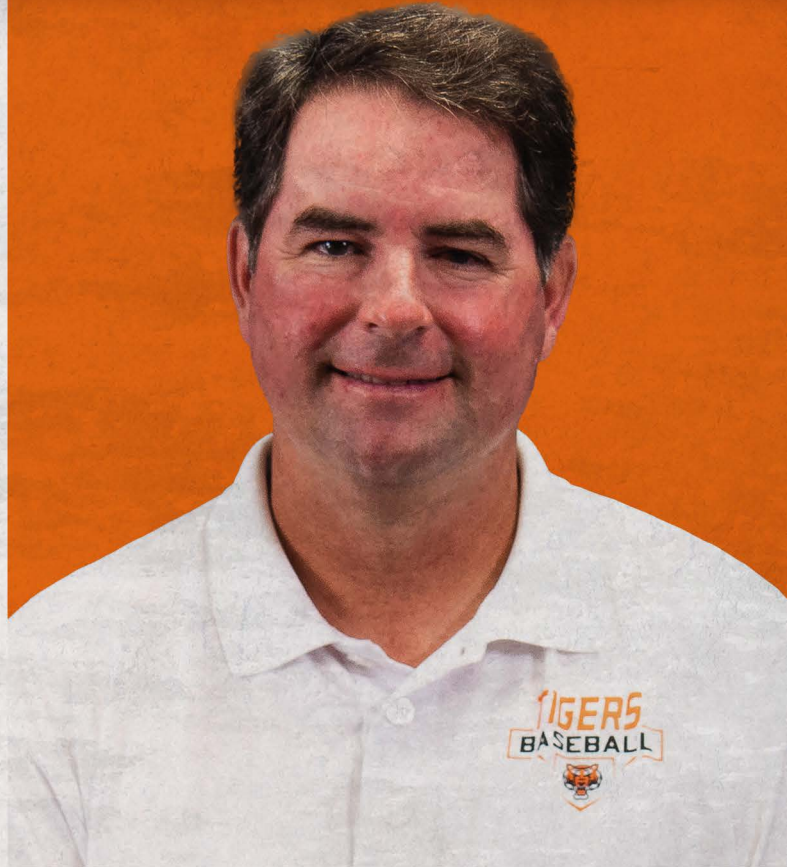

Evan Pratte joined the Rawlings Tigers in 2021 after serving as an Assistant Coach and Recruiting Coordinator at St. Louis University. Prior to his time with the Billikens, Pratte spent 21 seasons at Mizzou where he served as Director of Baseball Operations and worked extensively with the offense as a hitting coach.



During his time at Mizzou, Pratte helped guide the program to nine NCAA Regional appearances and one NCAA Super Regional while helping develop 34 All-Conference hitters.

Before joining the Mizzou staff, Pratte coached at Missouri State University and was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 13th round of the 1991 MLB Draft. He spent five seasons playing in the Detroit Tigers organization after a standout collegiate career at Missouri State.

Tiger fall is all about player development and making sure our players are in situations where their baseball IQ is being raised and moving in a positive direction. The focus is on attention to details when dealing with all aspects of the game in a team setting. Players in fall ball also get reps at secondary positions. Along with our Tiger coaches, players will get the experience of being coached by the Maryville coaching staff each week at practice. Fall ball games are played on Saturdays and Sundays, typically 3 games per weekend.

ACE PITCHING PROGRAM

\$225 PER MONTH FOR 1X PER WEEK

\$295 PER MONTH FOR 2X PER WEEK

\$345 PER MONTH FOR 3X PER WEEK

Designed for the serious, high-level pitcher who aspires to pitch in college. This program focuses on developing complete pitchers through structured training, mechanical development, and advanced pitching instruction. Classes run October through February.

TIGERS 11 WEEK PITCHING CLASS

\$405

The Tiger High School Pitching Program focuses on arm care, mechanical development, and preparing pitchers for the upcoming high school spring season. Classes meet twice per week for 11 weeks. Classes begin in December. This program serves as an excellent entry point for pitchers looking to establish a consistent high school pitching routine.

SWINGFORMANCE HITTING

\$1,500

30 sessions — November–January

Led by Braxton Martinez — Tampa Bay Rays

Swingformance is led by Braxton Martinez, a current professional hitting coach with the Tampa Bay Rays organization. This program is designed for the serious hitter, with classes meeting three times per week for 10 weeks at the Rawlings Training Center. Players receive 30 hours of focused hitting instruction and development.

Each player receives pre- and post-program reports, and training incorporates HitTrax, Blast Motion technology, swing speed drills, pitch recognition training, situational hitting, and many of the same drills Braxton uses with professional hitters in the Rays organization.

PRIVATE LESSON 10-PACK

\$405 (SAVE \$135 OFF RETAIL)

This is a great option for multi-sport athletes who need flexible schedules. Lessons are also an excellent way to supplement training and focus on specific skill development. Lessons are loaded into the player account, can be used during the spring season, and never expire.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS THE FEE TO PLAY FOR THE RAWLINGS TIGERS AND WHAT DOES IT INCLUDE?

The high school player fee for the summer of 2027 is \$3900 per player.

The following is included in the player fee:

- Full Uniforms
- Tournament Costs
- Practice Fields
- College baseball resources
- Player Profiles
- Team insurance
- Team equipment
- Team communication system
- Coach's pay and travel
- Winter training program focused on hitting and defense
- Iron Catchers winter training for catchers
- Unlimited facility use at Balls-n-Strikes Ballwin and the Rawlings Training Center

The following required items are not included in the player fee:

- Player travel costs including transportation, lodging and meals website. That registration is the commitment from the player to your team.

WHAT OTHER OPTIONAL COSTS MAY ARISE FOR MY SON WHILE PLAYING FOR THE TIGERS?

- ACE Pitching Training or Tiger Pitching Program
- Swingformance Hitting program

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW DO YOU DETERMINE AND HIRE STAFF?

We have assembled and recruited the best possible staff in the area to coach our Tiger high school teams and run our organization.

Our coaches must meet at least one of the following 5 criteria:

1. College baseball playing experience
2. Professional baseball playing experience (minor or major league)
3. High School baseball coaching experience
4. College baseball coaching experience
5. Major League Baseball scouting experience

Our staff is comprised of outstanding individuals and role models who have extensive baseball backgrounds and a strong passion for teaching the game. Our staff focuses on player development throughout the entire season while coaching in a very positive style.

All hired staff must go through our Tiger interview process, have references available and are required to complete a background check. We truly believe that our staff is the primary reason why the Rawlings Tigers are the premier summer baseball program in the area.

HOW MANY COACHES DO YOU HAVE PER TEAM?

Each high school Tiger team has 2 paid coaches, a head and an assistant coach.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW DO YOU PROMOTE TIGER PLAYERS AND WILL THE TIGER PROGRAM GET MY SON INTO COLLEGE BASEBALL?

Our goal is that every Tiger has a chance to play college baseball. This cannot in any way be 100% guaranteed. A lot of that is determined by his athletic ability, performance on the field, grades, work ethic, and make-up.

However, what we can guarantee is the following:

- Our staff will work with you to help get your son into college baseball if that is the option you want
- We have a forum, a facility, a blue print to follow and a network that we provide every Tiger player that cannot be found anywhere else.
- A dedicated Twitter handle to showcase players for college coaches currently followed by over 700 college coaches.
- A professionally made player profile for every player is on the Rawlings Tigers website and linked in rosters that are distributed to coaches and recruiters. This includes important academic, bio and baseball stats that recruiters need and request. The profile set up was reviewed, critiqued, and updated by several college baseball coaches in the state.
- Showcase events at our Rawlings Training Center.
- Competition in the most elite showcase tournaments in the Midwest.
- Training and structure modeled after major college baseball programs.
- Access to our VIP COLLEGE RECRUITING section, loaded with information, links and articles on the college baseball process.
- A Tiger network of coaches that have coached and played at the collegiate and professional level.
- Showcase and camp notifications as we receive them from our network of colleges.
- Guidance with recruiting letters and videos.
- An on-call sounding board for any questions, advice or input on the college process.

Each high school Tiger team has 2 paid coaches, a head and an assistant coach.

HOW DO YOU SET YOUR ROSTERS?

Our high school rosters are set each summer based on our tryout process. Immediately after the tryouts, our panel of Tiger staff members meet and slot the players using a depth chart system. Each team has 12-14 positional players (some of whom also pitch) and then some teams have pitcher only slots as well. We typically fill a few more pitcher only slots for the 17U rosters.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

DO YOU MOVE PLAYERS UP OR DOWN AFTER ROSTERS ARE SET?

Once we set our rosters and you commit to us, we commit to you. We go with what we have for the entire season. The only exception may be due to an injury or unforeseen circumstances where we are forced to adjust a roster. In those rare cases, we have conversations with the family involved and ensure that all parties involved agree to the move. We strongly feel this model is fair and advantageous to the player, the coaches, the families and the entire roster.

HOW DO YOU DETERMINE PLAYING TIME?

Our number one goal is player development: every player on every roster will get ample playing time to improve and showcase their talents. We fully understand the time and financial commitment with being a Tiger and every player will get their opportunities. This approach is different than a normal high school team because our number one priority is player development, not winning every game.

We are confident that through our development process and the type of talent that we attract, the end result will be wins on the field. Our general philosophy is that all players will play a lot and also sit a little. There are a lot of games in a condensed time frame and we need all players fresh and ready to perform.

WHAT IS YOUR SUMMER GAME AND PRACTICE SCHEDULE?

Some teams may start indoor practice sessions as soon as the majority of their players wrap up their high school seasons.

Outdoor practices start the week after Memorial Day.

In June & July, we play high level tournaments. The tournaments we chose focus on providing a forum for our players to showcase their talents. Teams travel 2-5 weekends. Our games are primarily played Thursday-Sunday, 4-5 games per weekend. High school tournaments do play day games on Thursday and Friday. We typically have Mondays off with practices on Tuesday and Wednesday.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHERE DO YOU PRACTICE?

We practice at local high school or college fields with some teams using the turf area and batting cages at the Rawlings Training Center. The schedule and locations will vary each season and with each team. Our practices are typically in the west St. Louis County area. For the 2026 season practices were held at Maryville University, Missouri Baptist University, DeSmet High School, and the Rawlings Training Center.

WHERE DO YOU TRAIN DURING THE OFF-SEASON?

Our off-season training and practices are held at both the Rawlings Training Center and Balls-n-Strikes Ballwin.

HOW DO OFF-SEASON PRACTICES WORK?

Off-season practice is scheduled for the team by our staff. Each team will have dedicated practice times that are preset for the full off-season. The days and times may vary, but you will have the full schedule in advance of the training that will start in late October or early November. We do not have sessions on Friday, but the facilities are available for players to train on their own.

HOW DOES YOUR TEAM COMMUNICATION WORK?

From August to May, all communication and information goes through our office. We primarily communicate through email. Our front office staff is also available by phone for any player or family. Once practices start in May, communication switches to the coaches. We will use an established communication platform. For the 2026 season, that was GameChanger. We will add all players and families to the chosen system.

DO THE TIGERS OFFER FALL BALL?

Yes! The High School Tigers Fall Ball program is optional for players who have accepted spots on the summer roster. Current seniors who were 17U Tigers also have the option to play Fall Ball with the Tigers. The cost for Fall Ball is \$925 and the payments are rolled in with the regular season payments. The fall program includes local tournaments as well as an advanced training program run in conjunction with Maryville University and their coaching staff.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

DO YOU HAVE A PITCHING PROGRAM IN PLACE?

There are 2 pitching program options available. Players will have the option to choose between the Tigers pitching program and ACE Pitching and will select their option during registration.

The Tigers 11 Week pitching class will meet 2x week for 11 weeks starting in December.

DO YOU HAVE PARENT VOLUNTEERS?

We do for Game Changer scoring. Some teams also have a parent who volunteers to live stream and record games.

HOW DO PLAYERS GET TO OUT OF TOWN TOURNAMENTS?

The family is responsible for out-of-town travel and logistics. Players are not allowed to travel on their own or stay in a hotel room by themselves. Families are responsible for all hotel costs.

WHEN ARE SCHEDULES RELEASED?

Tournament schedules are typically released no later than the end of February. We start releasing travel dates as soon as we know them and this can be as early as November.

Once the season starts, game schedules are typically released the week of the tournament, usually Monday or Tuesday, sometimes as late as Wednesday.

WHEN DO UNIFORMS ARRIVE?

Typically in May, depending on shipping times. All fees must be current to receive the uniform.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I HAVE HEARD THAT HIGH SCHOOL TOURNAMENTS ARE DIFFERENT THAN YOUTH TOURNAMENTS, WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

Typically, they are 4-5 game minimums. They can also start during the daytime hours on Thursdays and Fridays. Many tournaments do not have bracket play, you just play your scheduled games. Some events just have the top 2 teams play for a championship on Sunday. They also use more fields and are spread out around a city.
