**RELEASE, INDEMNIFICATION AND NON-DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT**

The undersigned, Parent, Guardian, and/or Participant, on behalf of itself and/or the Minor, Player, and/or Participant, ("Releasor") does hereby release, indemnify, hold harmless and forever discharge Savage Athlete, LLC, a Georgia Limited Liability Company ("SA"), Savage Athlete Foundation, Inc., a Georgia Non-Profit Corporation ("Foundation") and any of their respective heirs, executors, administrators, trustees, successors, assigns, transferees, affiliates, members, shareholders, managers, owners, directors, officers, employees, independent contractors, and those acting by, on behalf of, or through any of same ("Releasees") from any and all causes of action, suits, debts, sums of money, damages, injuries, emotional distress, judgments, claims and demands whatsoever, in law or equity, whether known or unknown, whether liquidated or unliquidated ("Claims"), which Releasor has, or may have, against Releasees as set forth below.

The Claims hereby released are in connection with any service, travel, seminar, meeting, instruction, class, practice, games, tournament, sporting activity, conference, gathering, joint or singular action or actions, or lack thereof, or other activity involving Releasor and any Releasee, now or at any time or times in the future. The release granted herein shall be continuing at all times.

Further, Releasor acknowledges that now or in the future, at any time and from time to time it may have access to, be provided with, or use in some way confidential information of any or all of the Releasees. Such confidential information includes, but is not limited to, all trade secrets, processes, programs, products, techniques, data, designs, plans, training methods, ideas, research, patents (provisional, pending, granted or otherwise), copyrights, service marks, trademarks, drawings, artwork, photography, videos, sound recordings or other information of any kind as well as all information regarding suppliers, vendors, customers, employees, investors, advisors, or contractors of any nature whatsoever transmitted to Releasor verbally, visually, electronically, or in writing. It shall further include any and all improvements, derivations, variations, claims or products relating to confidential information supplied to Releasor prior to, during, or after any prospective or actual business or other relationship between Releasor and any Releasee. Releasor further agrees that it will hold all such confidential information as such and that same remains the confidential information of Releasees unless changed by independent disclosure to the public domain or order of a court of law having jurisdiction over Releasees. Releasor agrees that Releasees may seek all legal and equitable remedies to protect such confidential information.

This Agreement shall be governed by Georgia law. It may not be amended without a writing signed by the party to be charged. Each party has sought independent counsel regarding the legal, tax or accounting effect of this Agreement and is not relying on the other party for same. Time is of the essence. This Agreement may not be assigned by Releasor without Releasees' prior written consent. Any waiver of this Agreement shall be non-continuing. Releasor acknowledges and agrees it has received good and valuable consideration for executing this rel

**RAWLINGS TIGERS COLUMBUS GA**  
**TRYOUT & COMMITMENT AGREEMENT**

This agreement is between Rawlings Tigers Columbus GA and the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the player attending tryouts. By registering and participating in tryouts, you acknowledge and agree to the following terms:

1. Tryout Process & Selection
  - a. Players will be evaluated during tryouts by the Rawlings Tigers coaching staff.
  - b. Parents will be notified within 48 hours of tryouts if their child has been selected for the team or designated as an alternate.
2. Commitment & Registration
  - a. Parents of selected players must complete the online player registration within ten (10) calendar days of receiving notification.
  - b. If registration is not completed within this timeframe, or if the player is unable to participate for any other reason, and no agreement is reached between the Manager and parent, the roster spot will be offered to an alternate.
3. Alternates
  - a. Alternates will be considered for roster openings if a selected player does not complete registration or is unable to participate.
  - b. Alternates are not guaranteed a roster spot but will be notified if an opportunity becomes available.

## **Youth Player and Parent Agreement**

Parents who accept a slot on a Rawlings Tigers team for their child agree to the following:

1. Parents will register their player online by the deadline set by the club including paying the club fees.
2. Players are asked to commit to their coaches for a minimum of one year and coaches are asked to make the same commitment to their players. The time frame of a year is considered to be from the time the offer to play is made until the end of the following spring season.
3. Parents agree to get their player fitted for their uniforms during the time frame set for fitting and to order all pieces of the required uniform including
  - a. Jersey or jerseys as designated by the coach
  - b. Tigers pants
  - c. Tigers helmet (optional)
  - d. Tigers equipment bag (optional)
  - e. Tigers game cap
  - f. Any other uniform item required by the coach
4. Parents agree to pay their coaches for team expenses in a timely manner. Some of these expenses include the following
  - a. Outdoor practice facilities
  - b. League fees
  - c. Tournament fees
  - d. Team equipment
  - e. Other items determined by the head coach
5. Players are expected to follow the Tigers uniform code.
6. Players are expected to remain in the dugout during all games.
7. Parents and other fans are expected to uphold the standard of the Tigers while watching games. This includes refraining from criticizing players on either team, umpires and coaches.
8. Parents (other than specifically designated coaches) are not allowed in the dugout at any time during games.
9. The Tigers expect that players will take advantage of additional training outside of their team events.
10. Tigers players are encouraged to use Rawlings products including bats, gloves and catcher's gear.
11. Players and parents are expected to follow the guidelines and philosophies of the Rawlings Tigers club. These can be summed up with the idea that player development comes before everything else.
12. Players and parents are expected to follow any other specific guidelines set by their coach

## **Tigers Parent Expectations and Behavior**

We view the parents as a big part of the Tiger program. We value your commitment to your son's baseball development and want you to know that you are a part of the Tiger organization as well. This program would not be possible without your support.

During games or any time at the ballpark, improper parent behavior will not be tolerated. Since you are an extension of the Tiger program, everything you do at the ballpark will reflect on our program. We will not tolerate parents:

1. Talking to an umpire for any reason
2. Being negative towards any Tiger player, opposing player, team, or coach; using abusive language
3. Negative yelling/cheering from the stands
4. Parents in or near the dugout during the game including parent volunteer scorekeeper

Players and parents are expected to obey the proper chain of communication. With all player vs. coach issues that may arise during the course of the season between each other, we would prefer the players, parents, and coaches all wait 24 hours before addressing any issues. This gives all parties ample time to gather thoughts and perspective instead of reacting in the heat of a situation.

The first chain of command is to have the player call or set up a meeting with the head coach. We really think this is important for your son's development as a person and a ballplayer.

If the issue is not resolved, the second chain of command is to have the parent call or set up a meeting with the head coach.

If the issue still exists, the last chain of command is either the parent or the player can contact Aaron only after they had the meeting with their coach.

We expect all parties (coaches, players, and parents) to handle every situation with class, dignity, and with an open mind approach.

As a Tiger parent, I have read the above expectations and agree to abide by them. I will also do my best to convey these expectations to other family members and friends that I bring to the game.
