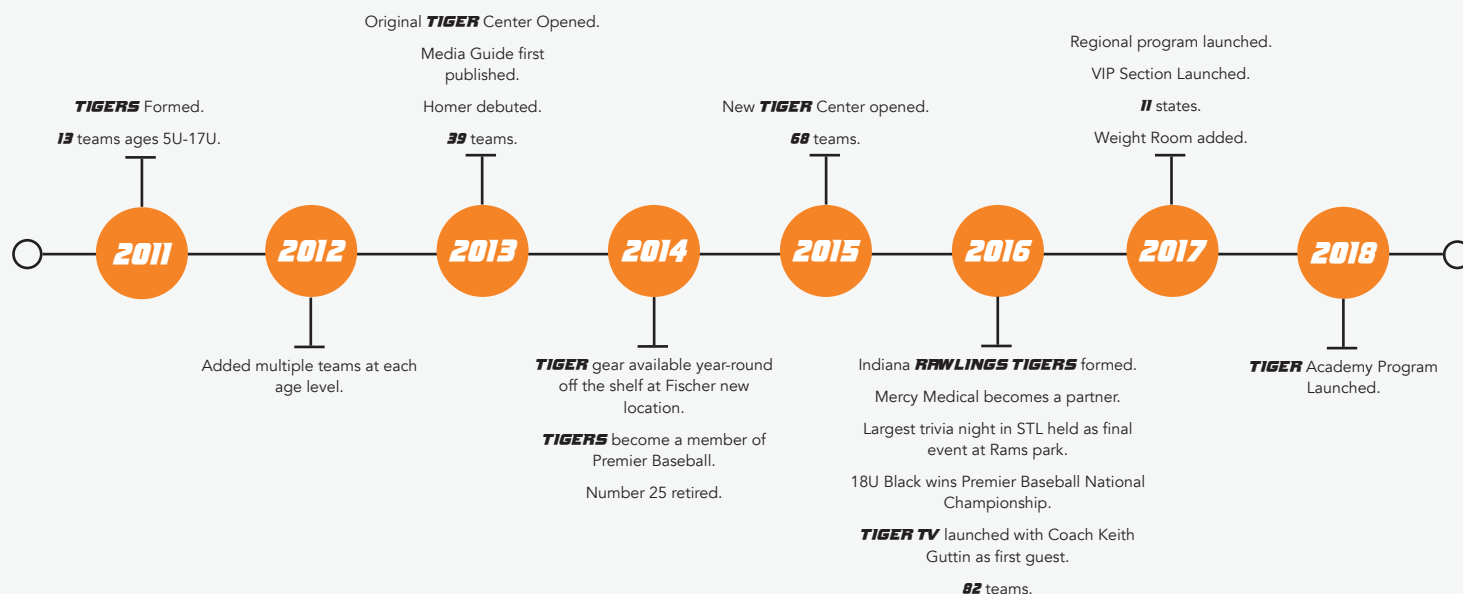
PROGRAM MISSION

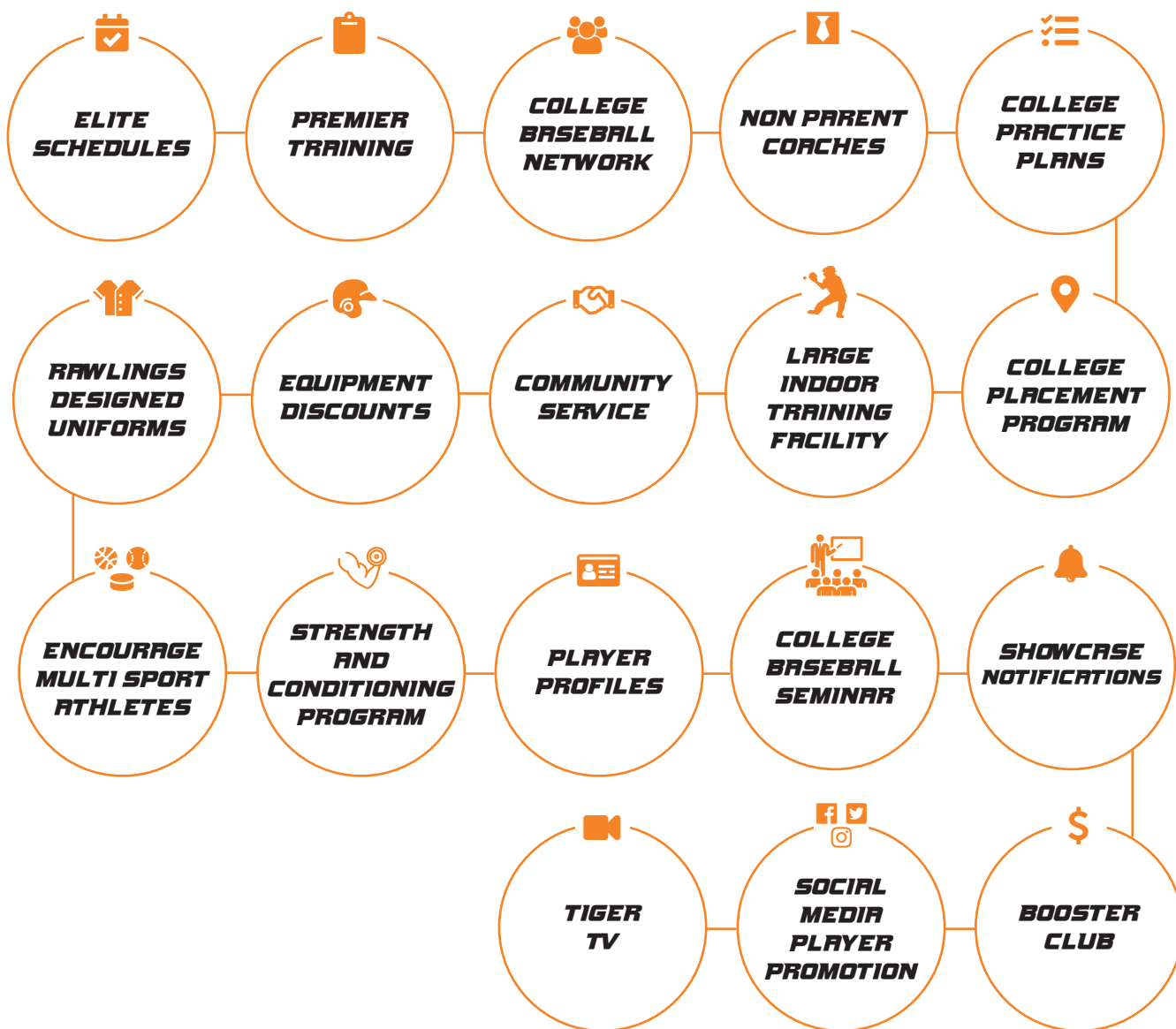

Our culture and our approach to our players and families have allowed us to maintain the original standard that we set when we launched our program. It has been a wonderful journey for so many people, and the following are some ways in which makes the Tigers a special place to play:

SUMMER SCHEDULE

The absolute goal of the Rawlings Tiger Baseball Club is to prepare each player for college baseball. Since that is the clear goal, Rawlings Tiger teams must play competitive schedules during the summer. This means very high-end tournaments including travel, gaining exposure from college scouts and recruiters.

The schedule will be released in February of 2019, but we are planning on playing 8 weekends in a row in June and July. At least 3 travel tournaments for each team will be scheduled and 4-5 may be included for some rosters. The other tournaments will be local driving distance. Each high school Tiger team will play approximately a 35-40 game schedule.

We practice mid-week on Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the summer. We will not be practicing until after the spring high school baseball season is finished. Once the high school season ends, we will do a "Spring Training Tiger Mini Camp" prior to our season starting.

EXPOSURE, BE SEEN WITH THE TIGERS

We play in high end exposure events throughout the Midwest. We have a network in place with other clubs outside of St. Louis, which enables us to play in elite events with large talent pools, which in turn attracts college scouts and recruiters. They can see multiple high-end players during the same weekend, which cuts down on their recruiting travel and cost. College coaches contact us for schedules in advance as our communication lines stay strong with these recruiters. Our goal is to have every Tiger in our program develop and have the opportunity to play college baseball. Development is achieved in our winter training program along with our summer practices and coaching. Exposure is the other factor in playing college baseball that cannot be overlooked and is not easy to get. Players have to have a platform to showcase their abilities and skills and the Tigers provide just that.

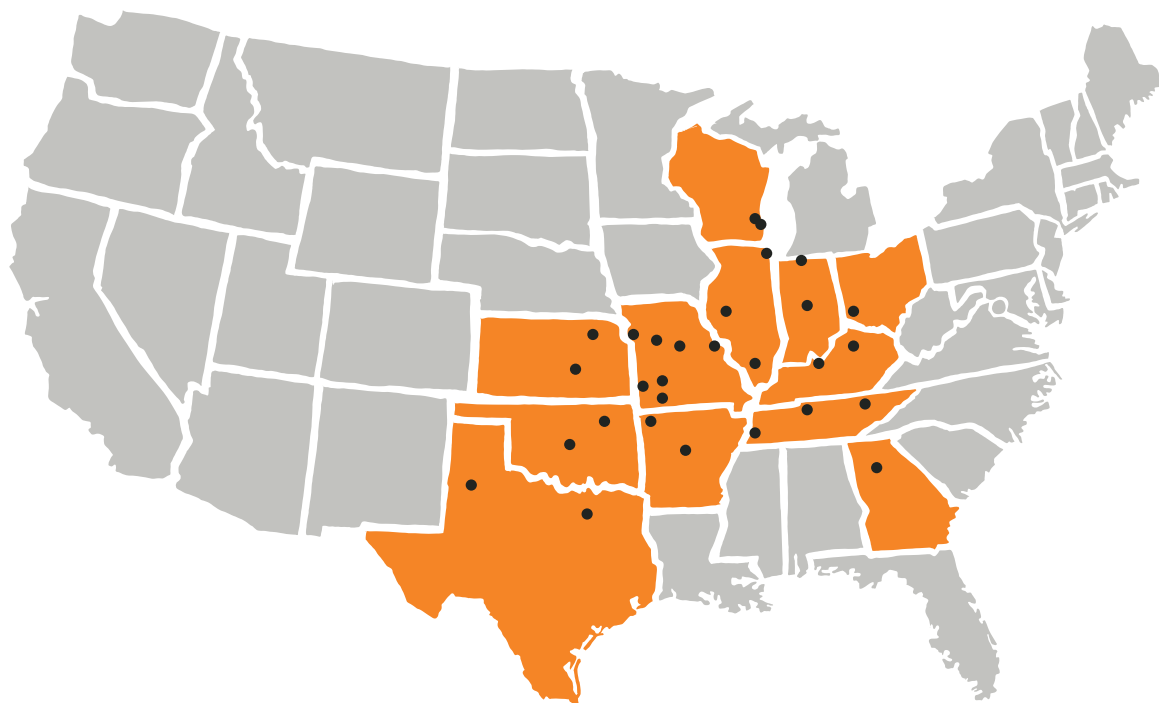

COACHING STAFF

Each Tiger high school team has 2 non-parent paid coaches that are individuals with extensive baseball experience. All hired staff must go through our Tiger interview process, have references available, and are required to have a background check completed.

All hired staff must meet at least one of the following 5 criteria:

1. College baseball playing experience
2. Minor league or major league playing experience
3. High School coaching experience
4. College coaching experience
5. Major league baseball scouting experience

**The Tigers reserve the right to hire a parent as an assistant coach if they meet one of the five criteria listed above.*

The head coach of each team will determine playing time, handle all parent questions and run detailed practices modeled after major college baseball programs. The Tiger admin staff, not the head coach, handles all schedules, winter training, travel details, uniforms, and other admin duties which will allow our coaches to focus 100% on teaching baseball.

Our coaches go through training meetings with our upper management to ensure club philosophies and expectations are carried out. All our staff is pulling in the same direction, this is very important to the Tigers and something that we hold to the highest standard.





PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

TIGERS STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING PROGRAM

The Tigers have their own strength and conditioning program. This takes place in-house at the Tigers gym located on-site at our facility. Each player will have a dedicated 4-month work-out plan catered for them based on age, strength, schedule, and position. Certified trainers on staff will lead this program. This makes a huge difference in our athletes as they can get all their baseball specific workouts completed in one location.



PLAYER DEVELOPMENT (WINTER TRAINING)

An extensive off-season Training program during the winter months at Balls-n-Strikes Ballwin is also included for every Tiger player. This is held at the Rawlings Tigers Training Center (Huntington Center) in Ballwin.

Our winter training program is the most dynamic training a high school player can get in the St. Louis area. It is extremely structured with groups/times/content. Pitchers see significant gains in velocity and hitters leave with a fundamental strong base and a plan in place with proper swing mechanics. Countless hours of research and development have gone into our winter training structure, we are very proud of our winter training and feel it is an integral part of our player development process. It is fast paced, it is dynamic, it is results driven, it is mapped out to mirror major college winter workouts. It is also flexible that will fit with your academic and multi-sports schedule.

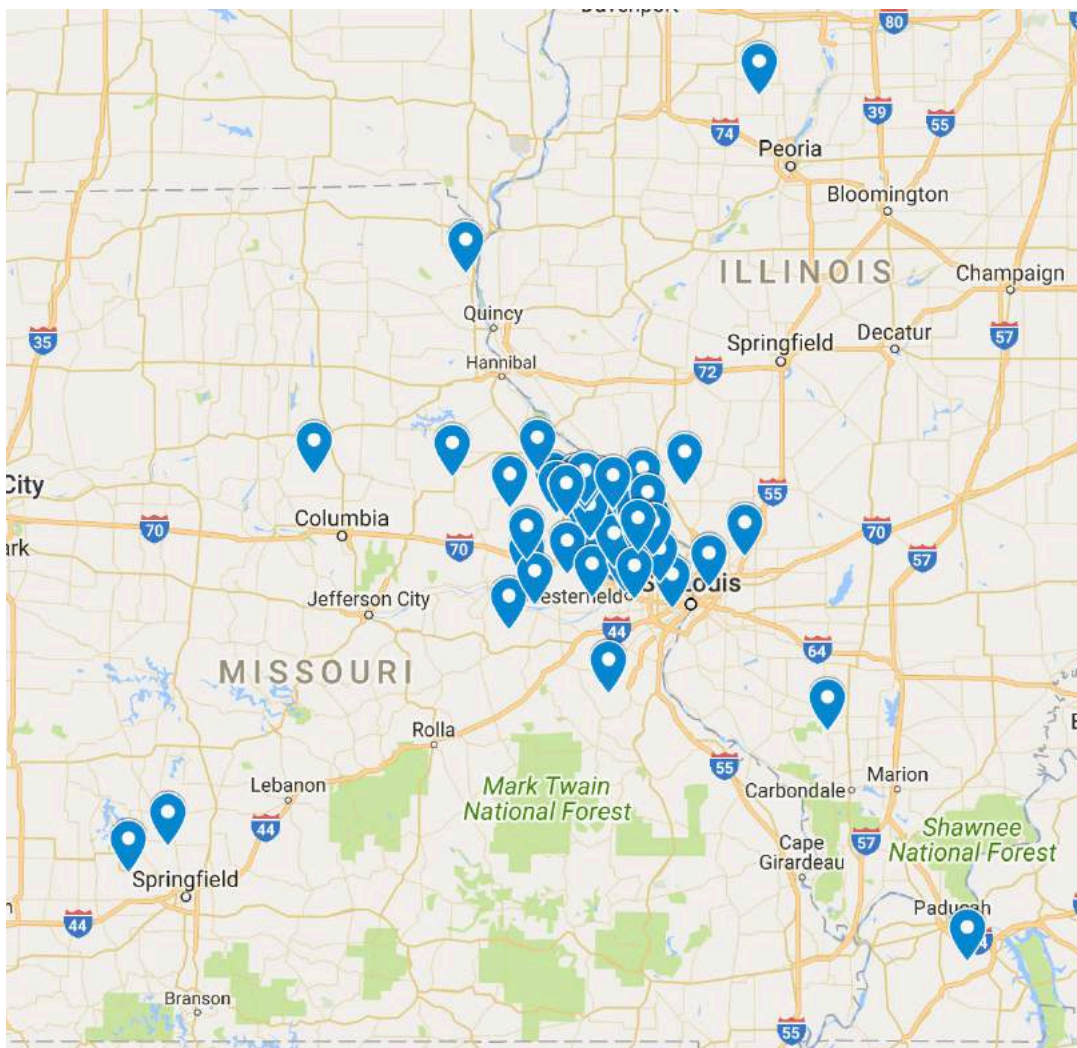
Our pitchers go through an extensive training and arm care strength building process before beginning detailed bullpen sessions. The pitching program is age appropriate and will maximize players of all levels and velocities. Pitchers will track progress with data charts and compete during this time.

Our hitting program is modeled after major D1 hitting programs. New curriculum is introduced each week, and hitters get tons of reps incorporating the drill work. Blast Motion and video analysis are both used in our hitting training. The hitting program is designed by the most renowned hitting instructor in the greater St. Louis area, Steve Hacker, our Tiger High School Hitting Coordinator.

TEAM AND PLAYER INFO

TEAM ROSTERS

We set our rosters early and we view our program as a year-round commitment for the dedicated and serious baseball player. Once you are invited on the Tigers and you commit with the first payment/ deposit by the due date, you are on the roster. We do not move players up or down during the season unless forced to by injuries or circumstances out of our control. We want to create team chemistry throughout the season with each roster. We also do not add players at any point during the season once the roster slots are full, unless due to injuries or someone leaving the program. We play with what we have, you commit to us and we commit to you.

This is subject to change but at this point we are planning on taking 14 positional players for each roster for the 2019 season. We also may have pitcher only players slotted beyond those 14 positional slots.

TEAM COMMUNICATIONS

We have very clear lines of communication set up in our program. Our coaching staff is very open-minded and approachable all season and we have a system in place for players and parents to get feedback from our staff at any point during the season. All situations are handled in a mature, productive, positive way to reach the best solution for the player and the team.

We also are very in-tune with getting the families schedules, park directions, rain outs, and practice updates out ASAP each week. We do this by using our team caller system along with our team e-mail distribution list. We also use e-mail for updates, newsletters, and club handouts through the year. We are a very pro-active club and we understand communication is a huge part of having a positive experience. We thrive on and enjoy the logistics side of running a club.

PLAYER REGISTRATIONS

Each high school player that accepts a slot on a high school Tiger roster will have to register for the program at Balls-n-Strikes in Ballwin anytime during the week after tryouts. The initial deposit is due at that time and parents will set up their accounts for the payment plan. Players and parents need to come in person to register. Players will choose numbers, be fitted for uniforms, and handle all required administrative items.

PLAYER PACKAGES AND FEES

Families choose the options they desire. The options you choose have no bearing on the team you are on or the playing time that you will have. We want families to make the decision that works best for them and their schedules. For 2019, the Tigers are offering a base package along with 3 optional programs. This gives families flexibility in building their own program that best fits their needs.

FALL TIGER SERIES - (15U/16U TIGERS)

The Tigers Fall Series is a 4-week program for 15U and 16U Tigers only. Based on enrollment, our staff will divide the players up into teams and play 9-inning Sunday games on 9/10, 9/17, 9/24, and 10/1. Players will stay on the same team for all 4 weeks. Part of this program will also include Wednesday dynamic practices from 5-7pm on 9/6, 9/13, 9/20, and 9/27. All teams will be grouped together for the practice and will focus on both primary and secondary position work. Locations for practices and games are TBA.

FALL PITCHERS AND POSITIONAL PLAYERS THROWING VELOCITY PROGRAM

This is a third year teaching program the Tigers are offering all high school players. The participants will meet 2 weeknights during the fall at an outdoor location TBA. The emphasis is on proper throwing mechanics, long toss, arm strengthening, and injury prevention. This is for both the pitchers and the positional players. Defensive repetitions will be a big part of this as pitchers will do PFP's and positional players will get skill work at their positions.

The .400 club is hitting sessions offered in January and February after our winter hitting session are through. These classes give the hitters rep sessions and training they need to be ready for the spring season. This is a lower cost alternate option to private lessons and also gives players an opportunity to hit with staff for those players whose high schools do not do winter optional workouts.

Twice a year, the Tigers do a Pizza Sales campaign using TJ's pizza fundraising service. 40% of all sales go directly back to you for selling. In 2018, our club sold over \$22,000 in pizzas

Aaron is the founder and president of the Rawlings Tigers Baseball Club. He is also the founder of Balls-n-Strikes which was established in 1999. He has helped grow Balls-n-Strikes into 7 locations and continues to expand the premiere brand of indoor baseball facilities. He is currently the owner/operator of Balls-n-Strikes Ballwin, which is the original Balls-n-Strikes.

Upon graduating from Lafayette High School in 1994, Aaron played 3 years of collegiate baseball at the University of Missouri where he earned All-American honors, All-Big 12 honors, and Academic All-American Honors. He still holds the following records at MU: single season RBI's (101), single season doubles (28), top 5 in MU history in single season at bats (249), single season extra base hits (43), and single season total bases (154). In 1996 Aaron was named the "Mizzou Athlete of the Year", was twice named the "Mizuno National Player of the Week", finished leading all of D1 schools with 101 RBIs that season and was also named the "Big 12 Tournament MVP" going 15-20 in that tournament with 15 RBIs and 6 doubles -- breaking Robin Ventura's record of hits and RBIs in a tournament. That same year, 1996, Aaron hit 4 home runs in a double-header vs Nebraska and also had 8 consecutive hits in a double-header vs Oklahoma and Oklahoma State. His freshman year in 1995 he had a walk-off home run against Oklahoma State, the #1 team in the country at the time, and also a walk-off home run against SEMO before his freshman year was cut short with a torn ligament in the elbow. His first two collegiate home runs came in a doubleheader in Stillwater against the Cowboys.

Aaron was then drafted in the 1997 MLB draft after his junior year of college where he was featured on the "Top 100 Prospects List" in the country by Baseball America. He chose to forgo his senior season at Mizzou and signed a minor league contract with the Minnesota Twins. While in the minor leagues, he went on to finish his degree in secondary education and graduated in 1998. He played 4 years of minor league baseball with the Minnesota Twins and the New York Yankees which included being invited to the Minnesota Twins fall instructional league in 1997. During the summer of 1997, he led the Appalachian league in RBIs and finished 2nd in the league in home runs and also led his Twins team in RBI, HR, At-Bats, Doubles, and extra base hits. He also played for the River City Rascals in-between the Twins and Yankees and hit the first ever home run at the new TR Hughes Stadium -- 1 of 16 home runs for him that summer. Aaron retired from pro-ball in 1999 to launch Balls-n-Strikes on a full-time basis. He brings that same competitive passion that he had on the field for teaching kids and high school ballplayers.

In 2006 he began to franchise Balls-n-Strikes locations, which now has 7 franchises across Missouri. Balls-n-Strikes has brought in the following major baseball programs to St. Louis area for camps: LSU, Mizzou, SLU, MO State, SEMO, Mississippi State, Arkansas, and Arizona State. His Balls-n-Strikes Ballwin facility has been the winter training home for numerous major league and minor league players over the last 18 years.

Aaron launched the Rawlings Tigers Baseball Club in the summer of 2011 with one team at each age level from 5U through 17U. It was a very successful first year in player development and getting the Tigers program on the map. For our 8th season, 2018, the Tigers have reached the 1,000 ballplayer plateau and is now the largest club in the United States with 66 Tiger teams in the St. Louis market.

In a short amount of time, the Tigers have had 129 of their players go on to play college baseball.

In May of 2017, Aaron and his staff launched the Tigers Regional Program, giving players and teams around the country the opportunity to become Tigers. They have full regional clubs started in Southern Indiana, Indianapolis IN, Omaha NE, and Jonesboro AR. They also have individual teams in Austin TX, Cincinnati, OH, Paducah KY, Knoxville TN, Tulsa OK, and Oklahoma City OK. A unique template is set up for teams to follow and use the many resources the Tigers provide.

Aaron has countless contacts in the baseball industry both locally and nationally from his playing days, from both building the Balls-n-Strikes brand across the Midwest, and from launching the Rawlings Tigers program. This has enabled him to assemble the best possible coaching staff in the Midwest for the Rawlings Tigers Baseball Club. This network of contacts will also help tremendously as our Tigers continue to graduate high school and enter college and/or pro baseball. He has the ability to provide a premier instructional staff, a premier facility, and a baseball network second to none to every Tiger player in the program.

Aaron is a leader in the sense of providing vision and a direct path to where the Tigers are heading, but at the same time lets his coaches coach and trusts their baseball knowledge and skills. He also has strong organizational, administrative, and business skills making the Tiger experience a very enjoyable and memorable one for all families involved. Aaron has an open, outgoing personality while always being available. He likes to be hands-on with the program, and works year-round every day building the Tiger brand.

He is married to Paula Jaworowski and has two children: Nolan and Ty.

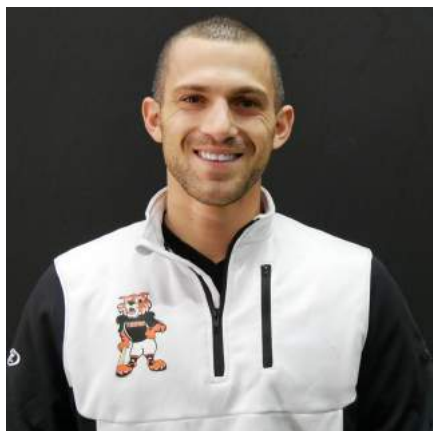
